Stable Economy

The island state though small in size and population (5 million people) has become a reputable financial center, a key regional trading center, the world's busiest port, and a top location for investment. Often cited as a model for transparency, efficiency and political stability, Singapore has earned recognition from around the world.

Climate

Singapore has an equatorial climate with a uniform temperature throughout the year, abundant rainfall and high humidity. The average daily temperature is 27°C with a maximum of 31°C in the afternoon and a minimum of 24°C before dawn.

Cost Of Living in Singapore

Here is an estimate of the expenditure to be incurred by a student per month:

- **Accommodation:**
\$400 (Rate is dependent on single, twin or triple sharing)
- **Transportation:**
\$75 (For a bus concession pass for unlimited travel on buses.
This may not be needed if you live within walking distance to campus.)
- **Food:**
\$300 (Meals on campus are more economical)
- **Miscellaneous:**
(Books, stationery, clothing, toiletries & leisure)
\$50 - \$100 (Such expenses vary according to the individual lifestyle and spending habits)
